Jesus said to his disciples:
"I have much more to tell you, but you cannot hear it now. When he comes, however, being the Spirit of truth he will guide you to all truth. He will not speak on his own, but will speak only what he hears, and will announce to you the things to come."
(John 16:12-13)

A few years back I watched a fictional television show called ***"Early Edition"***. The central theme was of a person who received the daily newspaper one day ahead of everyone else and was privileged to know all the news before it happened. He, thus, spent all his energy trying to divert such tragedies as buildings collapsing on people, car accidents, suicide attempts, etc. I only watched the show a couple of times because I remember feeling tense knowing all that was to happen in life and how that could effect us. This gospel reading from John mentions that the Spirit of Truth will *gradually* guide us in his own way.

As parents, many of you know that wisdom and understanding (Gifts of the Spirit) *gently* unfold in the lives of the young. Often it is frustrating to see them make mistakes, (some we may have even made ourselves), because they have not listened to *our* words of wisdom. They seem deaf to what is reasonable, that is what *we* see as reason! Is it not the same for we who have tried to live our lives without listening to the Spirit of God? Gradually the Spirit inspires us when our vulnerabilities lead us to be open to His voice. Are we ready to hear *all* that the future may hold for us? Perhaps, not! In each mile of our journey we become more confident because we know we do not walk the journey alone.

Today, being Trinity Sunday, we see the importance of the Triune God on that journey. The Creator who loved us into being, Jesus, the Son whose footsteps we follow knowing we have been redeemed, and the Holy Spirit who makes us "holy" by guiding us with his Gifts...in all of these we experience the Glory of God! Let us breathe deeply and easily knowing that we are loved and cared for, as only God can!

JOURNEY OF FAITH

This does not diminish the fact that the journey will be hard. The very setting of the Gospel is the night before Jesus died. As Saint Paul writes to the Romans, "[W]e even boast of our afflictions, knowing that affliction produces endurance, and endurance, proven character, and proven character, hope" (Romans 5:3-4).

Ultimately, our human journey is modeled by the Holy Trinity—a family of love among Father, Son, and Spirit that we are all called to emulate.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Once the early Christians realized that Christ's coming in glory was delayed, there was a need to provide for the governance and everyday needs of the church. The various "orders" within the church carried forward the apostles' ministry, but also allowed for a measure of creativity. The sacrament we call "holy orders" evolved somewhat slowly. At first, it made sense for Christians to use the forms they knew, adapting them to new situations. Synagogues, for example, were administered by a board of "elders," translated into Greek as *presbyteros*. We know from the Acts of the Apostles that a system of presbyters was a normal feature of church life from earliest days. They stood in relationship to another order, that of "overseers," translated into Greek as *episkopos*, giving us the English "bishops." The bishop was the shepherd, the faithful tender of the flock, one who offered the Eucharist, forgave sins, and maintained the bond of charity. Just as the deacons were the chief advisers for the charitable life of the church, so were the presbyters meant to advise the bishop on the spiritual life of the faithful. They were trusted advisers at first, not pastors or priests as we understand those terms today.
